

PRIMARY ACCESS FOR KIDS



Welcome to the Primary Access for Kids Program!

The Primary Access for Kids program allows your child to see a primary care provider for certain health care services in an assigned clinic at no charge. This program is for children attending the Madison Metropolitan School District who are unable to get health insurance in any other way. It is not a health insurance program. If your child is eligible for health insurance at any time, he/she will no longer qualify for Primary Access for Kids.

The following services are available under Primary Access for Kids

- Annual physical exams
- Primary Care Office visits at your assigned primary care clinic, including visits when your child is sick.
- Some prescription medicines
- Transportation to and from primary care appointments

Primary Access for Kids provides your child with the specific services listed above. There may be other programs offered to help you access services not covered by this program.

The Primary Access to Kids Program is an initiative of the Dane County Health Council.
