

Born to Puerto Rican parents. Princeton graduate.

Served as Southern New York District Court.

Has taught at NY Law School and Columbia Law.

A Supreme Court justice since 2009. First Hispanic justice and third woman to serve.

Sotomayor is known for her passionate stance on civil liberties and the rights of marginalized communities, often earning her the nickname "the people's justice".

Influential Latinos in the US

Born in Los Angeles. Granddaughter to Mexican immigrants. Whos parents faced discrimination. She was not taught Spanish for fear of discrimination, and the thought of protection for her.

Graduated from San Diego State University where she studied Physics.

Ellen got a research job at Sandia National Laboratories in Livermore, California after she received her doctorate. Her work on computers and information processing helped develop computer systems for space travel. Outside of work, she obtained a pilot's license to fly small planes.

In 1991 she became an astronaut and in 1993 she became the first Latina astronaut.

Born August 7, 1962 in French Camp, California. Considers Stockton, California, to be his hometown.

Received his masters Electrical & Computer Engineering, University of California

Developed quantitative x-ray film imaging analysis techniques that allowed for the development of human tissue absorbed dose models useful for medical imaging applications.


